WHEREAS, by Section 912 of the Education Law, a school district which is the district of residence for a particular student may enter into agreement with another school district for the purpose of providing health and welfare services for said student(s) who attend a non-public school, and

WHEREAS, during the 2019-20 school year, Rhinebeck Central School District is eligible to provide said health and welfare services to pupils who attend a non-public school situated within the boundary of Rhinebeck Central School District, namely Primrose Hill School, Rhinebeck, New York, and

WHEREAS, said health and welfare services include those provided under Section 912 of Education law, as appropriate, and

WHEREAS, it has been calculated that the cost of such services would be \$1,070.69 per pupil, based upon the calculations set forth in commissioners decisions and the NYSED guidance document

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Rhinebeck Central School District does hereby authorize a health and welfare service agreement with each District of Residency

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board President, Superintendent of Schools, and Clerk of the Board are duly authorized to sign and execute such agreement on behalf of the Rhinebeck Central School District.*

Motion upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools to extend the intermunicipal agreement with the Town of Rhinebeck regarding facilities use through August 31, 2021.*

BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY #1230 - PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AT BOARD MEETINGS

The Board of Education recognizes its responsibility to hear and respond to public comment, and therefore encourages public participation at Board meetings. There will be a specific agenda item at each Board meeting to provide an opportunity to address the Board.

Rules of Order In Public Meetings

- When a member of the public wishes to speak, he/she shall address the chair.
- If two or more persons wish to speak, the chair shall designate the person to speak first.
- The speaker shall give his/her name and address before proceeding further.
- All remarks shall be addressed to the chair.
- The speaker shall confine him/herself to the question under debate, and avoid comments of a personal nature.
- No person shall speak upon a subject more than twice, no more than five minutes each time, except by consent (of the Board)
- No person shall speak a second time until all have had a first chance to speak.
- The right to each individual to speak without interruption is paramount, provided they remain in accordance with these rules.
- No calls for expression of sentiment shall be made except upon request by the chair.
